APPOINTMENT OF A SERVICE PROVIDER TO CONDUCT RISK MATURITY ASSESSMENT AND REVIEW OF POLICIES AND STANDARD OPERATING PROCEDURES

TERMS OF REFERENCE

1. Scope of work

To appoint a qualified service provider to undertake a risk maturity assessment on the current state of the adequacy and effectiveness of risk management throughout the Municipality and the Risk Management Function, as well as give recommendations for improvements.

The successful service provider will be required to provide the following services as a minimum:

- Assess risk and governance documents (policy, framework, Risk Management guide).
- Assess the risk management activities undertaken.
- Assess the extent to which management participates in identifying risks.
- Assess the alignment of risk profiles to the Municipality's strategy and goals.
- Assess the adequacy of risk reporting.
- Assess the maturity of Municipality's risk management processes and practices.
- Assess the strategic risk processes.
- Assess the operational risk processes.
- Assess the Risk Management function.
- Identify areas of improvement in line with the best practice and prescribed risk management frameworks.

The assessment should be aligned to the following but not limited to:

- MFMA and Treasury Regulation requirements
- Municipal System Act
- National Treasury's Public Sector Risk Management Framework (PSRMF)
- Committee of Sponsoring Organizations (COSO) framework
- King Code on corporate governance principles, and
- Other applicable assessment tools

In addition, the successful service provider will be required to review and revise the Municipality's Policies, Systems and Standard Operating Procedures (Sop's).

2. Duration

The service will be required for a period not exceeding 90 days. Payment shall be made monthly upon receipt of agreed upon reports and completion of review. The service provider must draft and submit a proposed project implementation plan indicating the action steps, activities, responsibilities, start and end dates per action and price per activity/deliverable.

The total cost must be inclusive of VAT.

- (b) Review policies and procedures.
- (c) Table and present policy findings and recommendations to stakeholders.
- (d) On approval, present all revised draft policy documents to stakeholders for the Council approval process.

- (g) Prepare and present Project Close-out report to stakeholders.

- 1.5 Failure on the part of a tenderer to submit proof or documentation required in terms of this tender to claim points for specific goals with the tender, will be interpreted to mean that preference points for specific goals are not claimed.
- 1.6 The organ of state reserves the right to require of a tenderer, either before a tender is adjudicated or at any time subsequently, to substantiate any claim in regard to

preferences, in any manner required by the organ of state.

2. DEFINITIONS

- (a) "tender" means a written offer in the form determined by an organ of state in response to an invitation to provide goods or services through price quotations, competitive tendering process or any other method envisaged in legislation;
- (b) "price" means an amount of money tendered for goods or services, and includes all applicable taxes less all unconditional discounts;
- (c) "rand value" means the total estimated value of a contract in Rand, calculated at the time of bid invitation, and includes all applicable taxes;
